## Chesapeake Curling Club Clubs





In 2008, Talbot County Department of Parks and Recreation added a brand new waterfront park adjacent to the Oak Creek Public Landing. This land was purchased with Project Open Space funds with the intent to protect 1.5 acres from development and provide an open space for citizens to appreciate the beauty of the surrounding land and water. This project began in 2009 with the removal of an old residence and a small, run-down building. Our Parks and Recreation crew worked very hard to

replace impervious footprints with green space. Native plants and trees replaced concrete walkways. Benches were strategically placed in the park for patrons to relax and enjoy the waterfront view. You may also enjoy watching the local birds, people kayaking, and watermen return from their day out on the Miles River. This expanded public waterfront access is located between Easton and St. Michaels which makes it a popular spot for locals and tourists alike. We invite you to visit the park to enjoy the scenery.

## SHERWOOD LANDING

Sherwood Landing is located between St. Michaels and Tilghman Island. The 300 foot pier allows fisherman to cast their line into Dunns Cove which feeds into the Choptank River. The pier is also a good place to catch crabs. This landing was damaged during Hurricane Isabel and funds were

provided to repair the landing back to its original beauty. Benches are provided for citizens to enjoy the waterview. A stepdown platform is available to launch kayaks and canoes. The parking is limited, so please be courteous to neighbors of the landing when using this facility.




## Living Shoreline

One of the many sites we have been looking at restoring along the Chesapeake Bay accesses of Talbot County is located at 22150 Bay Shore Road, near the village of Wittman. The site has been used by citizens and visitors alike to launch canoes, watch the sunset horizon line, and marvel at birds in flight aloft the winds of our Chesapeake Bay. The County has applied for a permit to restore a living shoreline to this

access point making it more environmentally friendly for our community. The project consists of construction of a living shoreline which will stabilize erosion by installing 150 linear feet of stone sill with sand backfill behind and marsh grass plantings to create a significant wetland terrace and marsh area at the end of Bay Shore Road. We anticipate construction to take place in 2010 at the site, converting it into our newest waterfront park facility.

Continuing our efforts to restore several other access points that were at the "end" of the road it has been rewarding to see their results. Seymour Avenue Waterfront Park in St. Michaels, Sinclair Avenue Waterfront Park in Tilghman Island, and Oak Creek Waterfront Park in Newcomb are all examples where these efforts are paying off environmentally. If you live along the Chesapeake Bay how about your "end" of the road being explored as a place to establish a living shore line as well? Who knows you might even find that you have lived on "Green Up Street" all along.

# A Dedicated Volunteer

CATHERINE RUST, ASSISTANT DIRECTOR OF TCDPR INTERVIEWS PAUL MACKENZIE, JAMIE WEBB ICE HOCKEY COACH

**CATHERINE: WHEN DID YOU START VOLUNTEERING FOR THE JAMIE WEBB ICE HOCKEY PROGRAM THROUGH TALBOT COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF PARKS AND RECREATION?**

**PAUL:** My son was three years old which would mean I have been coming to the rink at 7:00 am on Saturdays for the past 15 winters.

**CATHERINE: WHAT IS THE JAMIE WEBB FOUNDATION?**

**PAUL:** Jamie Webb was a local high school student who died as a senior in high school. Jamie's mentor, a former Boston Bruins hockey player, and others created the Jamie Webb Foundation to help fund a program to allow youth access to ice hockey at little to no cost.

**CATHERINE: WHAT DO THE KIDS LIKE THE MOST ABOUT JAMIE WEBB?**

**PAUL:** Although we teach numerous skills, the kids seem to particularly like sliding on their stomach under a limbo-like structure. The kids who take Jamie Webb typically return for more sessions and also move onto the next level with Eastern Shore Hockey Association (ESHA).

**CATHERINE: WHAT DRIVES YOU TO HELP WITH JAMIE WEBB?**

**PAUL:** Clearly I have a passion for ice hockey. I also coach the Saints Peter and Paul High School hockey team. The Jamie Webb program is an ideal opportunity for kids to determine if they might like hockey without the typical significant costs associated

with the sport. It is rewarding to have up to 40 kids out on the ice with big smiles on their faces.



## TALBOT COUNTY PUBLIC LANDINGS & RAMP PERMITS

Any person using a Talbot County Public Boat Ramp for launching or removing a vessel with a boat trailer shall display a valid Talbot County Landing ramp sticker (issued annually). Parking a boat trailer at a County Landing also requires a valid sticker.

The sticker shall be displayed in the following places: **BOAT TRAILER** - drive side tongue, 1 ft. from the hitch. **VEHICLE** - drive side rear bumper if a permit/sticker holder has multiple boats/trailers, it is recommended to display the sticker on the vehicle.
