Request: Amendment #2 to Bill No. 1524 – A Bill to amend Chapter 190 of the Talbot County Code (Zoning, Subdivision and Land Development) regarding solar energy systems.

Commissioner Boicourt moved that the Planning Commission does not recommend approval to the County Council of Amendment #2 to Bill No. 1524. The Planning Commission does find Amendment #2 to be consistent with the Talbot County Comprehensive Plan. The Commission is concerned that the Public Service Commission will not uphold Amendment #2 and that Amendment #2 may cause fragmented solar development in the county. Commissioner Strannahan seconded the motion.

The additional language could read as follows, "A parcel of agricultural land upon which a large scale solar energy system designed to generate more than 2 MW of power.."

Commissioner Ghezzi moved that the Planning Commission would recommend approval and find the amendment to be consistent with the Talbot County Comprehensive Plan if the County Council introduced an Amendment, modifying Amendment number #1 which included language similar to the following example "a parcel of agricultural land upon which a large scale solar energy system designed to generate more than 2 MW of power". Commissioner Strannahan seconded the motion.
