

A RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE TALBOT COUNTY COMPREHENSIVE WATER & SEWER PLAN, AS ADOPTED BY TALBOT COUNTY RESOLUTION 100, TO EXTEND THE SERVICE AREA OF THE REGION II (ST. MICHAELS) WASTEWATER SYSTEM TO CERTAIN AREAS THAT INCLUDE TAX MAP 33, PARCELS 105 AND 38 AS S-1, IN THE SECOND ELECTION DISTRICT, TALBOT COUNTY, MARYLAND; PURSUANT TO THE POWER AND AUTHORITY CONTAINED IN THE ENVIRONMENTAL ARTICLE, TITLE 9, SUBTITLE 5, OF THE ANNOTATED CODE OF MARYLAND (*Kirkham Station*)

RESOLUTION NO. 144

A RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE TALBOT COUNTY COMPREHENSIVE WATER & SEWER PLAN, AS ADOPTED BY TALBOT COUNTY RESOLUTION 100, TO EXTEND THE SERVICE AREA OF THE REGION II (ST. MICHAELS) WASTEWATER SYSTEM TO CERTAIN AREAS THAT INCLUDE TAX MAP 33, PARCELS 105 AND 38 AS S-1, IN THE SECOND ELECTION DISTRICT, TALBOT COUNTY, MARYLAND; PURSUANT TO THE POWER AND AUTHORITY CONTAINED IN THE ENVIRONMENTAL ARTICLE, TITLE 9, SUBTITLE 5, OF THE ANNOTATED CODE OF MARYLAND

WHEREAS, the County Council of Talbot County, State of Maryland, by Resolution Number 100 has adopted the October 2002 Report of the Review of the Comprehensive Water and Sewerage Plan (the "Plan"); and

WHEREAS, the owner of Parcels 105 and 38 on Tax Map 33, in the Second Election District, Talbot County, Maryland, has requested to extend the service area of the Region II (St. Michaels) Wastewater System which serves the Region I (Unionville, Tunis Mill and Copperville) sewer service area; and

WHEREAS, the above referenced properties consists of a commercial establishment with existing structures and has a projected peak wastewater flow of 300 gallon per day to be served by the Region II (St. Michaels) Wastewater System; and

WHEREAS, the Talbot County Department of Public Works has processed the request to extend the service areas and program the sewer service designations of the St. Michaels Water System and the Region I (Unionville, Tunis Mill and Copperville) Wastewater System; and

WHEREAS, Flow Allocation for sewer service will be made in accordance with the current sewer service policy of the Region I (Unionville, Tunis Mill and Copperville) Sewer Service System; and

WHEREAS, after October 1, 2007, the new wastewater treatment facility will be operational; and

WHEREAS, the Talbot County Council has considered the request, and hereby approves the same, subject to the terms of this Resolution and compliance with applicable design and technical requirements, rules, and regulations of all local, state, and federal authorities;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the County Council of Talbot County, Maryland as follows:

Section 1. The County Council is acting pursuant to Title 9, Subtitle 5, of the

Environmental Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland.

Section 2. The Talbot County Comprehensive Water and Sewerage Plan shall be amended to show Parcels 105 and 38 on Tax Map 33 as having the sewer classification of S-1, immediate priority status.

Section 3. The proposed subdivision shall follow the Flow Allocation Program for sewer service in accordance with the current Region II Sewer Service Policy.

Section 4. The peak flow sewer allocation, based on 185 gallons per day per equivalent dwelling unit, shall be 300 gallons per day for the commercial business with the sewer allocation being restricted to serve the lots of record as shown in the 2007 Tax Assessment Records with the gas station and commercial structure, and this request shall not be expanded to serve any additional uses.

Section 5. The owner of Parcels 105 and 38 on Tax Map 33 shall be responsible for all design and construction costs related to tying a low pressure sewer system into the County-owned force main.

Section 6. The Amendment, to include immediate priority for water and sewer utility extensions, shall be in accordance with the attached additions and changes and shall be permanently entered into the currently effective Comprehensive Water and Sewerage Plan as part of Chapters 1, 2, and 3.

Section 7. Inclusion of the proposed utility extension, planned for immediate priority in the Talbot County Comprehensive Water and Sewerage Plan, shall record capacity demand increases, as identified herein, on the serving wastewater treatment facilities.

Section 8. Adoption of this amendment, by the County Council of Talbot County, shall authorize the construction of the projects in accordance with and subject to the approval of the Municipal, County, State, and/or Federal agencies, as may be required, effective from the date of adoption.

Be It Further Resolved that this Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its date of passage.




