A RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE TALBOT COUNTY COMPREHENSIVE WATER & SEWER PLAN, AS ADOPTED BY TALBOT COUNTY RESOLUTION 100, TO EXTEND THE SERVICE AREAS OF THE EASTON WATER AND WASTEWATER SYSTEMS TO CERTAIN AREAS THAT INCLUDE TAX MAP 26, PARCEL 45 AS W-1 AND S-1, IN THE FIRST ELECTION DISTRICT, TALBOT COUNTY, MARYLAND; PURSUANT TO THE POWER AND AUTHORITY CONTAINED IN THE ENVIRONMENTAL ARTICLE, TITLE 9, SUBTITLE 5, OF THE ANNOTATED CODE OF MARYLAND (*Town of Easton – Hunter’s Mill*)

RESOLUTION NO.

A RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE TALBOT COUNTY COMPREHENSIVE WATER & SEWER PLAN, AS ADOPTED BY TALBOT COUNTY RESOLUTION 100, TO EXTEND THE SERVICE AREAS OF THE EASTON WATER AND WASTEWATER SYSTEMS TO CERTAIN AREAS THAT INCLUDE TAX MAP 26, PARCEL 45 AS W-1 AND S-1, IN THE FIRST ELECTION DISTRICT, TALBOT COUNTY, MARYLAND; PURSUANT TO THE POWER AND AUTHORITY CONTAINED IN THE ENVIRONMENTAL ARTICLE, TITLE 9, SUBTITLE 5, OF THE ANNOTATED CODE OF MARYLAND (*Town of Easton – Hunter’s Mill*)

WHEREAS, the County Council of Talbot County, State of Maryland, by Resolution Number 100 has adopted the October 2002 Report of the Review of the Comprehensive Water and Sewerage Plan (the “Plan”); and

WHEREAS, the owners, Shore Lands, LLC, of Parcel 45 on Tax Map 26, in the First Election District, Talbot County, Maryland, have requested to extend the service area of the Easton Water and Wastewater Systems; and

WHEREAS, the documentation to reclassify the Hunter’s Mill subdivision on Parcel 45 on Tax Map 26, prepared by the owners was reviewed by the Town of Easton; and

WHEREAS, the Hunter’s Mill subdivision shall consist of up to 310 detached single family dwellings with a projected water demand of 89,295 gallons per day and a project wastewater flow of 71,364 gallon per day; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Easton, in the First Election District, Talbot County, Maryland, has processed this request to extend the service area and program the water and sewer service designations of the Easton Water and Wastewater Systems; and

WHEREAS, after January 1, 2007, the new wastewater treatment facility for the Town of Easton was completed; and

WHEREAS, Flow Allocation for sewer service will be made in accordance with the Easton Utilities’ service tariff; and

WHEREAS, the Talbot County Council has considered the request, and hereby approves the same, subject to the terms of this Resolution and compliance with applicable design and technical requirements, rules, and regulations of all local, state, and federal authorities; and

WHEREAS, the County has verified that these facilities are within the boundaries of the municipal corporation of the Town of Easton, thus permitting the Easton Water and Wastewater system service improvements to be extended to the areas specified in this Resolution;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the County Council of Talbot County, Maryland as follows:

Section 1. The County Council is acting pursuant to Title 9, Subtitle 5, of the Environmental Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland.

Section 2. The Talbot County Comprehensive Water and Sewerage Plan shall be amended to show Parcel 45 Tax Map 26 having the water and sewer classification of W-1, S-1, immediate priority status.

Section 3. The proposed subdivision shall follow the Flow Allocation for sewer service in accordance with the Easton Utilities' service tariffs.

Section 4. The Amendment to include immediate priority for sewer utility extension shall be in accordance with the attached additions and changes and shall be permanently entered into the currently effective Comprehensive Water and Sewerage Plan as part of Chapters 1, 2, and 3.

Section 5. Inclusion of the proposed utility extension, planned for immediate priority in the Talbot County Comprehensive Water and Sewerage Plan, shall record capacity demand increases, as identified herein, on the serving wastewater treatment facilities.

Section 6. Adoption of this amendment, by the County Council of Talbot County, shall authorize the construction of the projects in accordance with and subject to the approval of the Municipal, County, State, and/or Federal agencies, as may be required, effective from the date of adoption.

Be It Further Resolved that this Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its date of passage.
