TALBOT COUNTY, MARYLAND FY 2020 PROPOSED BUDGET

Budget Overview

- The County Council received funding requests for Operating and Capital Outlay of \$98,962,440, which is \$6.9 million dollars more than the current FY 2019 budget.
- The FY 2020 Budget reflects a slight decrease from the current General Fund Budget. This Budget is funded in part with revenues of almost \$4.0 million from Prior Year Fund Balance.
- Great effort was taken in the development of this budget which maintains current services for our citizens while continuing to maintain two of the lowest tax rates (Property Tax and Income Tax) in the state.



PROPERTY TAX CAP FY 2020 PROPOSED BUDGET

- In order to fund expenses for Talbot County Public
- Schools, the Talbot County Council has proposed to
- override the voter imposed Property Tax Revenue Cap.
- This is authorized by State law in order to fund
- Education expenses only. This budget proposes to
- override the tax cap by \$1,345,500, which correlates to
- an increase of 1.8¢ in the Real Property Tax rate.

TALBOT COUNTY, MARYLAND FY 2020 Proposed Budget

Budget Highlights

•Talbot County Public Schools (TCPS) operating appropriation is \$936,330 above the required level of Maintenance of Effort (MOE), an increase of \$1,844,227, or 4.63 % from FY 2019. The County is funding an additional \$409,170 for programs not included in Maintenance of Effort, as well as an additional \$3.7 million in debt service. Debt Service has increased by over \$1 million from FY 2019 to pay for one half of the annual debt service on the new Easton Elementary School.

•TCPS will also receive an additional \$665,518 in State funding that was added by the State legislature (Kirwan funds).

•The FY 2020 Capital Projects Budget includes the following project for Talbot County Public Schools:

■\$11.0 million for a new Easton Elementary School, bringing the total County contribution for this project to \$30 million.

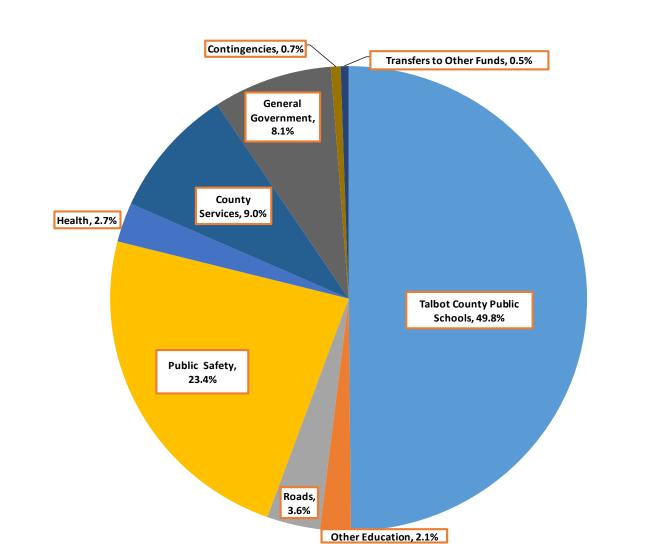
•Salary scale adjustments for Sheriff Deputies and Correctional Officers to address recruitment and retention issues
