## **Budget Strategy**

- The FY 23 Proposed Budget has been developed to maintain core services, to provide for workforce stability, investment in capital projects addressing infrastructure, and in the improvement of public safety, education, and other general services.
- It closely mirrors the FY 22 funding levels and maintains a healthy fund balance in order to be optimally positioned for future economic uncertainties such as are being seen with inflationary pressures, escalating fuel and commodity costs, and the possibility of delays or disruptions in supply chains.
- The proposed budget continues to support the operational strategy of investing in Personnel, Processes, and Projects which are key elements in effectively providing public safety and general services.

## **Budget Overview**

- The FY 2023 Proposed General Fund Budget is \$112,607,000 (essentially flat compared to the current FY 2022 Budget).
- Included in this budget is over \$3 million for transfers to the Capital Projects fund and \$3 million for Capital Outlay (equipment) purchases. This Budget is funded, in part, with revenues of \$14.3 million from Prior Year Fund Balance.
- The FY 2023 budget for Operating Expenses is increasing by 7.7%, which is less than the 8.5% increase in the Consumer Price Index.
- This Budget includes a 1 cent increase to the Property Tax rate above what is allowed under the Real Property Tax cap as authorized by the voters of Talbot County in November 2020. This Budget also includes a 1 cent Education supplement to support Talbot County Public School's budget initiatives.
- Public Safety is a top priority in this budget.

## **Budget Highlights**

- Graduated expansion of 24/7 Paramedic Unit in the northern end of the County which will improve response times.
- Funding enhancements to the volunteer fire departments to address operational costs and to support training and personnel retention and recruitment.
- Enhanced support for the Sheriff's Office.
- Property acquisition or construction to house the Sheriff's Office and the Health Department.
- Fully funding the educational commitment and additional supplemental and capital requests from Talbot County Public Schools.
- Investment in roadway enhancements, culvert replacements and the extension of sewer services.
- Investments in information technology for greater efficiency, transparency and data security.

# **Budget Highlights**

- Increase in operations budget is less than inflation.
- Funding for increased retirement expense associated with joining LEOPS (Law Enforcement Officers Pension System) for paramedics.
- Cost of living and step increases for all eligible employees to address inflationary and recruitment and retention issues.
- 13 new positions added 4 additional positions for a 12 hour/day Emergency Medical Services Unit, 3 deputies and 1 civil process server for the Sheriff's Office, 1 plan reviewer for Permits & Inspections, 1 machine equipment operator for the Roads department, 1 landings officer for Parks and Landings, 1 administrative assistant for the Circuit Court, County Communications Specialist/Public Information Officer and restructuring of open positions in Planning & Zoning to create two new positions.

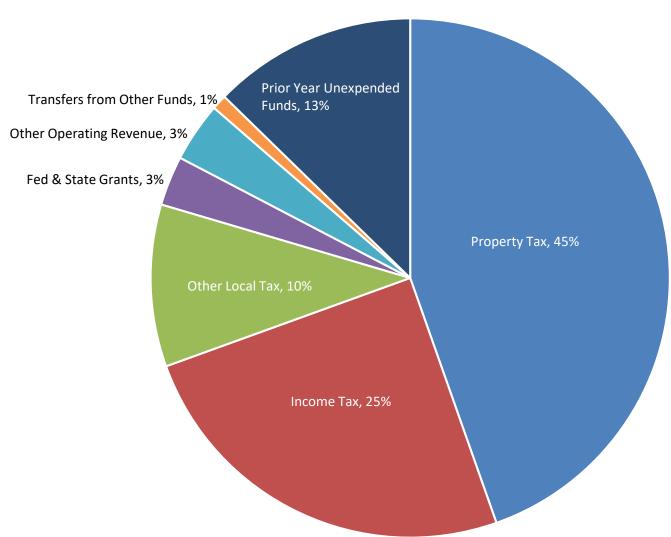

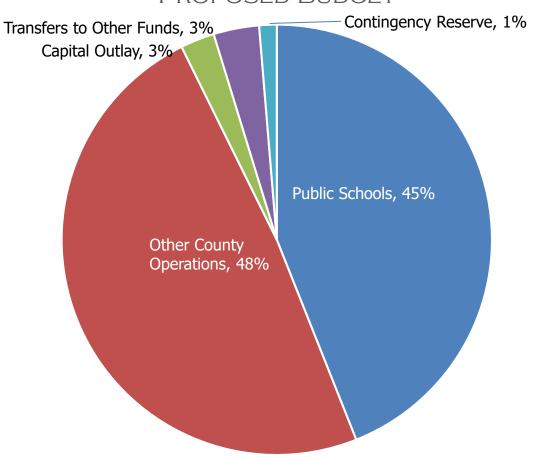
